

Weekly Market Review

Effective close of business 2/26/2021

Economic & Market Developments

- The S&P/Case-Shiller Home Price index increased 1.1% in December. This is 10.1% higher than one year ago.
- New Home Sales in January were up 4.3% in January, exceeding expecatations at 2.1%. Pending Home Sales were up 13% from last year.
- Durable Goods Orders grew 3.4% in January, compared to consensus estimates at 1.1%
- Weekly Initial Jobless Claims ticked lower to 730 thousand. This was well below expectations at 838 thousand and the previous week at 841 thousand.
- The PCE Price Index in January was up 1.5% from year ago levels.
- The University of Michigan Consumer Sentiment index dropped to 76.8 from 79.

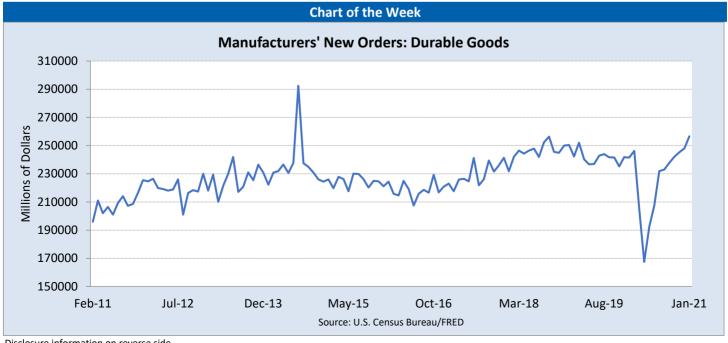
