Ann Arbor, Michigan, November 6, 2015 – Bank of Ann Arbor is pleased to announce four initiatives aimed at honoring and thanking our troops.

Walt Byers, Bank of Ann Arbor Saline District President, will be traveling to Guam (Navy), Kadena Air Base (Air Force), Iwakuni (Marines), and Pearl Harbor. During his trip, he will be visiting local troops, including Ethan Miller from Ypsilanti Township, Glenn Bruneau from Clinton, Cole Hatch from Dexter and several Michigan military families based at Pearl Harbor. The goal is to not only say ‘Thank You’ to the troops, but to bring a little bit of home to each of them. The trip will be co-hosted by Bubba from W4 Country and will be broadcast live on the W4 morning show as well as having a significant social media presence so that our communities can follow and share with their friends. “I am honored, humbled, and excited to go on this trip,” said Walt Byers. “Knowing that I can personally say thank you to our troops, and bring messages to and from their homes is very special. I can’t wait to meet them and learn more about what they do and how they are doing.”

Bank of Ann Arbor will also support Veterans by participating in the National Campaign: “Greenlight A Vet.” The color green is significant because it represents hope and renewal. Additionally, the term greenlight is often used to show forward movement. The goal of the campaign is to show our Veterans that the community supports them.
